## Choosing Your Book

- Choose a book that interests you! It should inspire you. No Requirements as far as District Reading fair, but check with your teacher!
- KidsReads.com; reviews
- Novelist.com; recommendations
- Find a Book Mississippi (lexile.com/fab/ms)

### English Language Learners

- Can create bilingual presentations
- Represent their native language as well as English
- Each element must be translated into English for judging

### Storyboards

- Must be STANDARD size- 36"H x 48" W
- Boards that are SMALLER or LARGER will be disqualified.
- NO identifying information on front. A label plate will be given for the BACK of board.
- Props, etc. can fit in the middle of the display but can't exceed the width, depth, of height of board.
- NO items protruding from the back or top
- NO electrical cords

#### Elements

- Elements for Individual and Group Literary Fiction
  - Title
  - Plot Summary; Summarize the story in a written response
  - Conflict: The problem in the story
  - Author
  - Main Characters
  - Solution or Resolution
  - Publisher and Publication Date
  - Setting
  - Author's Study

## Digital Media Projects

- PowerPoint, Google Slide or other Presentation Software
- For the School/District Reading Fair, A Digital Presentation is acceptable but not recommended. Check with your English teacher about her requirements.
- Provide your own charged device; Needs to be available for a few days.
- Maximum time limit: 3 minutes
- Please be excellent and catch the judge's attention.

- You can print them from home or view them online.
- Copies of a student checklist are on the table in the library along with some sample boards.

## Judging

- If you win the school fair and accompany your project to the district fair, be prepared to answer
  - Which character was your favorite? Why?
  - How did you decide upon the design?
  - What was the best part of the story? What part, if any, did you not like?
  - Do you want to know more about the topic?


#### More Judging Notes

- Clarity of Writing
  - Neat & Inviting
  - Captures Attention and Easily Understood
- Creativity
  - Original, imaginative, clever use of unique materials
- Quality of Project (durable)
- Thoroughness of Written Information
- Interest Evoked
  - Real effort shown, visually appealing, attracts others makes viewer want to read.

#### What are the Judges Looking For?


- Elements are NEAT and EASY to understand.
- Complete sentences
- CREATIVITY! CREATIVITY!
- White boards with pencil writing will not make the judges want to stay long!
- Did you follow directions?
- Does your project make others want to read the book you chose?
- Did you do the work yourself?
