Super Summer Passport Activities

The following activities may be typed or hand-written and are due on Friday, August 12, 2022.

Required by <u>all</u>:

Write a letter (minimum of one page) to your seventh grade Language Arts teacher introducing yourself. Tell about your likes and dislikes. Explain any successes and challenges you have faced in reading, writing, and grammar. What are your expectations for seventh grade?

Complete <u>at least one</u> of the following:

- 1. Choose a character in your summer reading book and write a one-page letter TO that character expressing your likes and dislikes toward that character.
- 2. Draw a detailed picture of a person you met or a place you visited during the summer or a character from one of your summer reading books. Write a descriptive paragraph to accompany your drawing.
- 3. Watch a movie that is new to you. Make a poster that includes a review of the movie AND pictures/illustrations of the actors/actresses, theme, plot, and setting of the movie.
- 4. Make a homemade dish for your family. Write a one-page description of the preparation and the enjoyment of the cuisine. Include the recipe.
- 5. Interview an adult such as a grandparent or neighbor. Ask him/her what life was like when he/she was in middle school as well as world events at that time. Provide a written record of the interview questions and answers.
- 6. Draw a map of a place you visited over the summer. Be sure to label specific places (states, cities, historic landmarks, etc.) & geographic landmarks (oceans, lakes, mountains, etc.)
- 7. Choose a meaningful song that relates to you or your world. Write out the lyrics and explain why they have special meaning for you.
